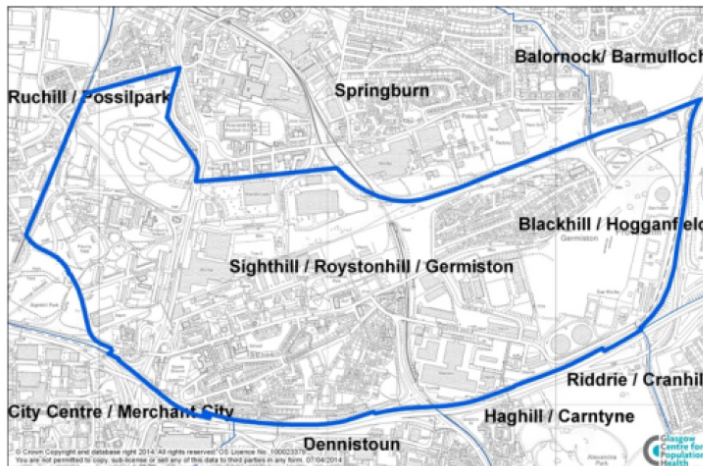


Sighthill, Roystonhill and Germiston

Sighthill, Roystonhill and Germiston is a neighbourhood in the north east of Glasgow with a population of 6,138.



Neighbourhood comparisons with Glasgow

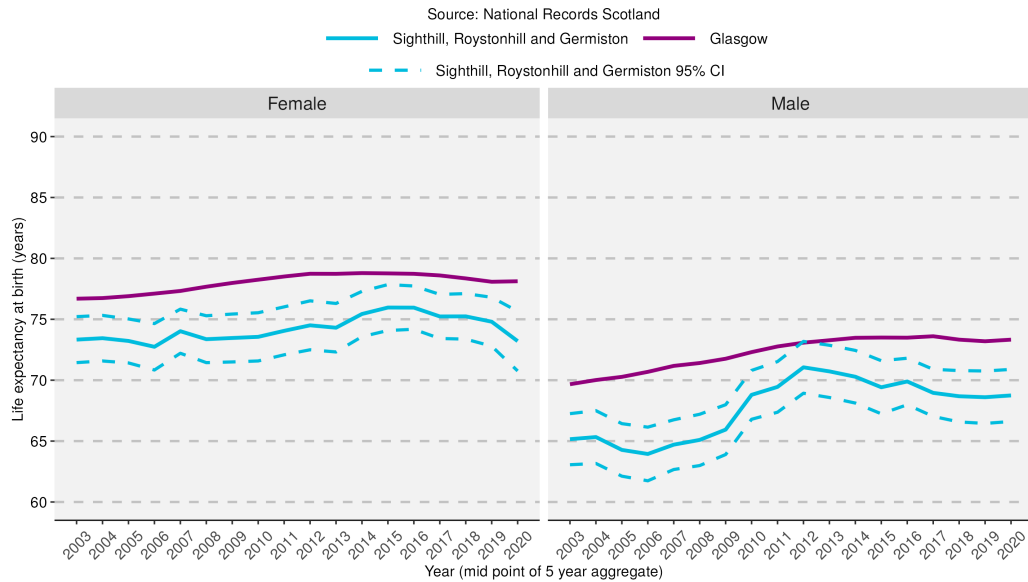
Women in Sighthill, Roystonhill and Germiston live, on average, four and a half years longer than men. The percentage of children living in the neighbourhood is considerably higher than the Glasgow average, while there is a lower than average proportion of older people - defined as aged 65 years and over. A high percentage of the population are living in income and employment deprivation and a third of children are living in poverty.

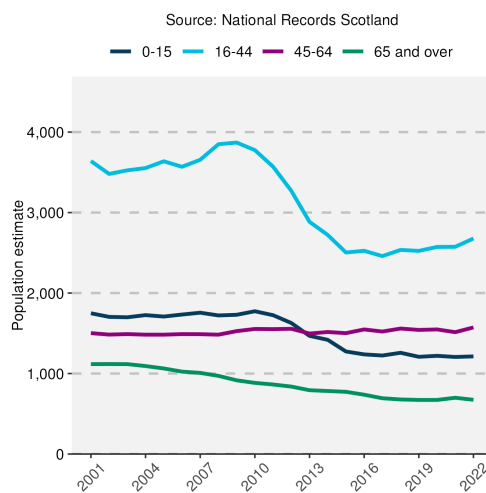
Neighbourhood/Area trends

Life expectancy at birth

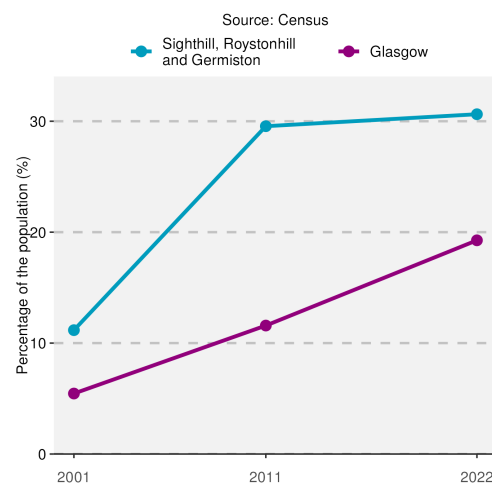


Life expectancy for males has risen in recent years in Sighthill, Roystonhill and Germiston but is below the Glasgow average. In the most recent period shown (2018-2022), life expectancy in this area is lower than the Scottish average.

Percentage of total population from a minority ethnic group



The overall population of Sighthill, Roystonhill and Germiston decreased between 2001 and 2022. This is largely due to a decrease in all age groups except adults aged 45-64 which slightly increased. The percentage of the total neighbourhood population from a minority ethnic background increased from 11.2% in 2001 to 30.6% in 2022 and was above the Glasgow average.

Notes

1. Data sources: Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation (SIMD) 2020, Census 2022, 2011, and 2001, National Records of Scotland (NRS).
2. Populations presented in the population trend chart and used to calculate life expectancy estimates are taken from NRS small area population estimates and are based on: the 2001 and 2011 Census for years 2001-2010; and the 2011 and 2022 Census for years 2011-2022.
3. This publication has used small area population estimate data published by the NRS on 21 November 2021. The NRS update their small area population estimates and previous estimates on an annual basis therefore this data is only representative of the data published upon this date. 4. The Income deprivation and Employment deprivation indicators are derived from SIMD 2020, more information on this deprivation index can be found at: <https://www.gov.scot/collections/scottish-index-of-multiple-deprivation-2020/>.
5. Life expectancies are calculated based on population estimates and death registrations. 95% confidence intervals have been added on the graphs to the neighbourhood data to give an indication of their accuracy. The 95% confidence interval for the Glasgow and/or Scotland comparison line has been removed due to the size of the population. This resulted in the confidence interval sitting on the data line making it unreadable. The x-axes of the life expectancy graphs give the mid-year for each life expectancy estimate e.g. 2020 represents the life expectancy estimate for the period 2018-2022.
