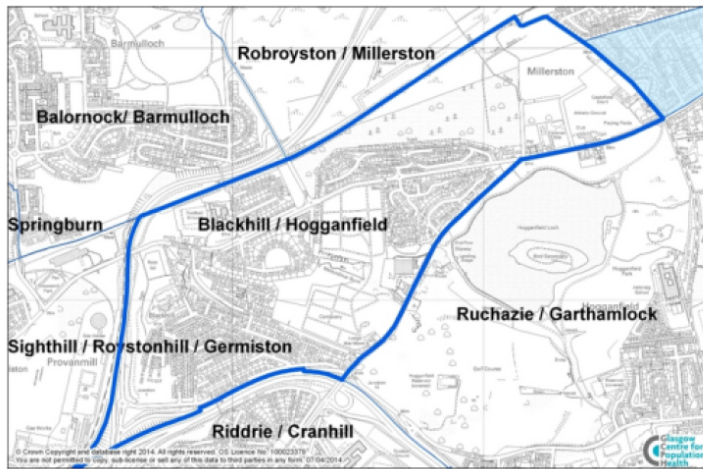


Blackhill and Hogganfield

Blackhill and Hogganfield is a neighbourhood in the north east of Glasgow with a population of 3,357.



Neighbourhood comparisons with Glasgow

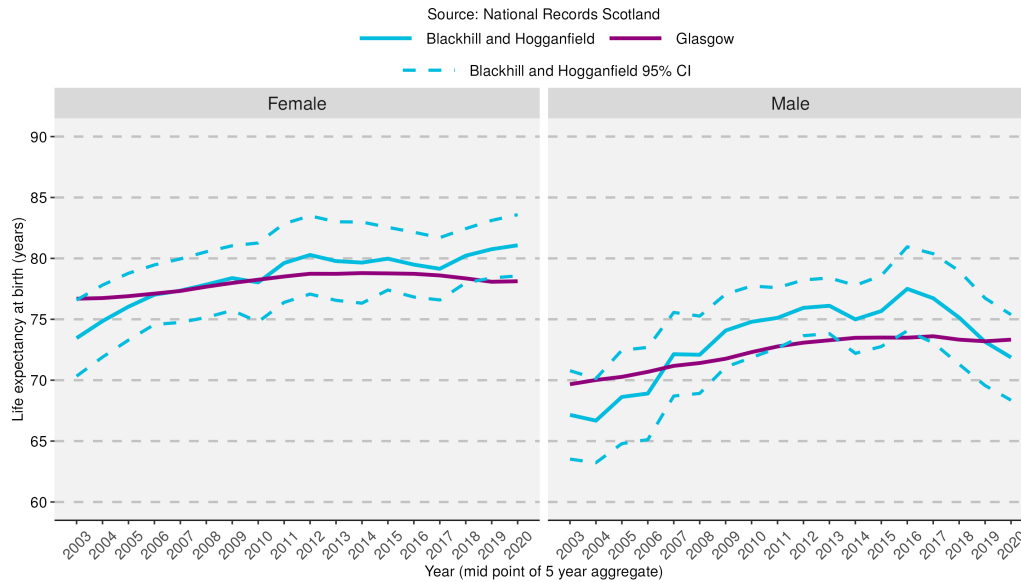
Women in Blackhill and Hogganfield live, on average, nine years longer than men. The percentage of people limited “a lot” or “a little” by disability is relatively high, 30%. Lone-parent households make up 15% of all households, which is 44% higher than the Glasgow average.

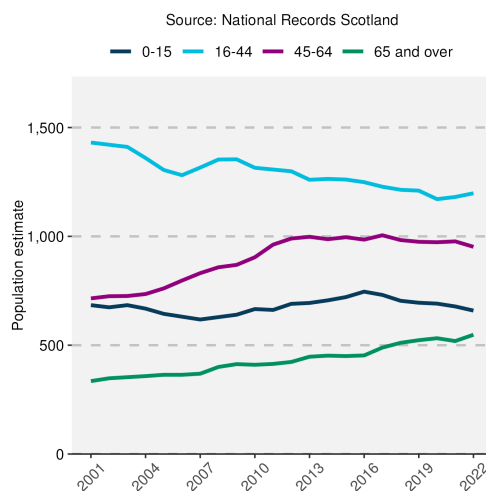
Neighbourhood/Area trends

Life expectancy at birth

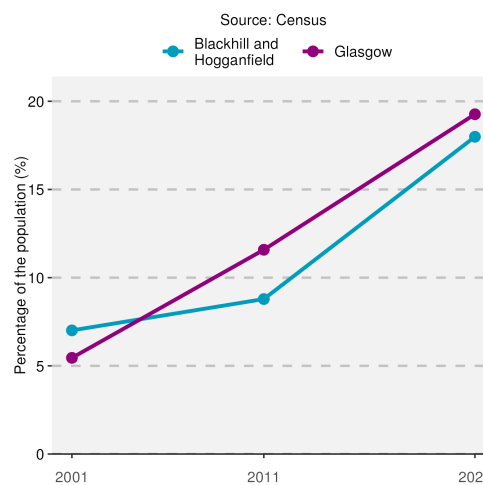


Life expectancy for females has risen in recent years in Blackhill and Hogganfield and is above the Glasgow average. In the most recent period shown (2018-2022), life expectancy in this area is higher for females than the Scottish average.

Percentage of total population from a minority ethnic group



The overall population of Blackhill and Hogganfield stayed roughly the same between 2001 and 2022. Throughout most age groups there were fluctuations, with the exception of a larger increase in those aged 65 and over, which therefore resulted in its overall position. The percentage of the total neighbourhood population from a minority ethnic background increased from 7% in 2001 to 18% in 2022 and are below the Glasgow average.

1. Data sources: Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation (SIMD) 2020, Census 2022, 2011, and 2001, National Records of Scotland (NRS).
2. Populations presented in the population trend chart and used to calculate life expectancy estimates are taken from NRS small area population estimates and are based on: the 2001 and 2011 Census for years 2001-2010; and the 2011 and 2022 Census for years 2011-2022.
3. This publication has used small area population estimate data published by the NRS on 21 November 2021. The NRS update their small area population estimates and previous estimates on an annual basis therefore this data is only representative of the data published upon this date. 4. The Income deprivation and Employment deprivation indicators are derived from SIMD 2020, more information on this deprivation index can be found at: <https://www.gov.scot/collections/scottish-index-of-multiple-deprivation-2020/>.

Life expectancies are calculated based on population estimates and death registrations. 95% confidence intervals have been added on the graphs to the neighbourhood data to give an indication of their accuracy. The 95% confidence interval for the Glasgow and/or Scotland comparison line has been removed due to the size of the population. This resulted in the confidence interval sitting on the data line making it unreadable. The x-axes of the life expectancy graphs give the mid-year for each life expectancy estimate e.g. 2020 represents the life expectancy estimate for the period 2018-2022.
