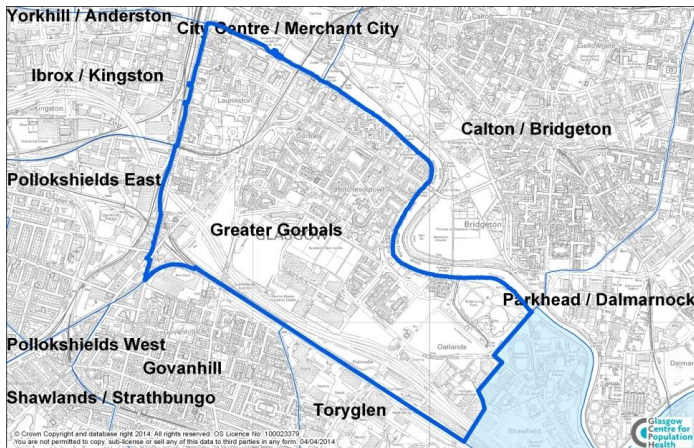


Greater Gorbals is a neighbourhood in the south of Glasgow with a population of 8,530.

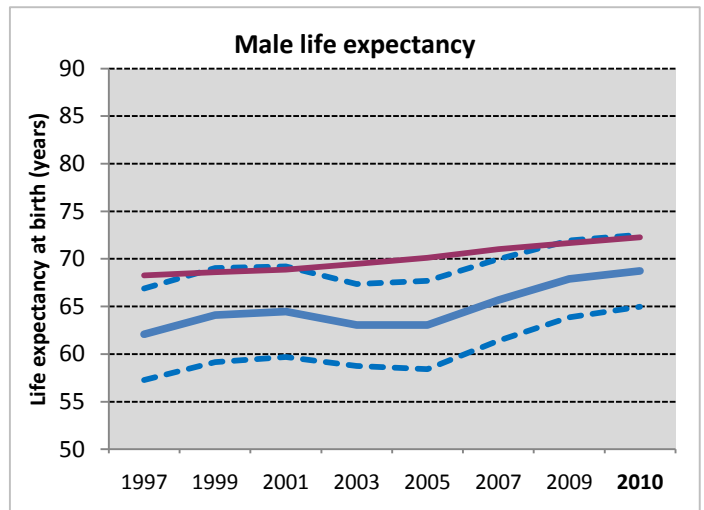
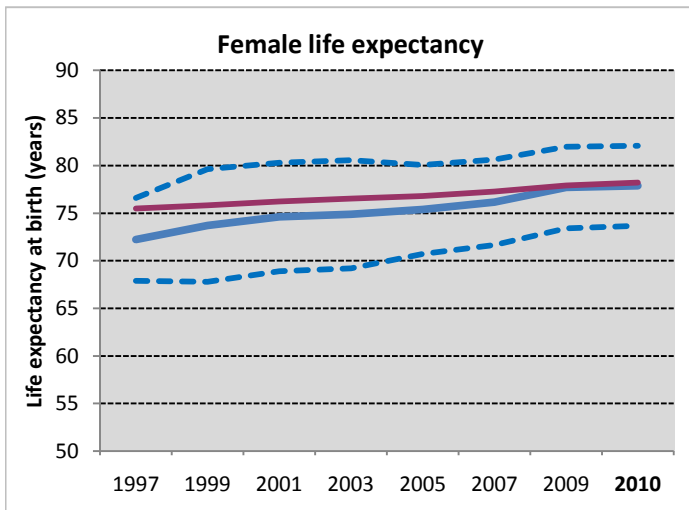


## Neighbourhood comparisons with Glasgow

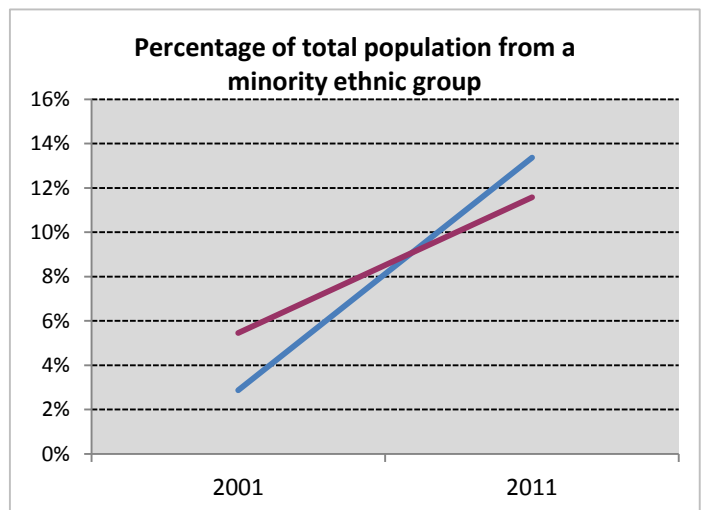
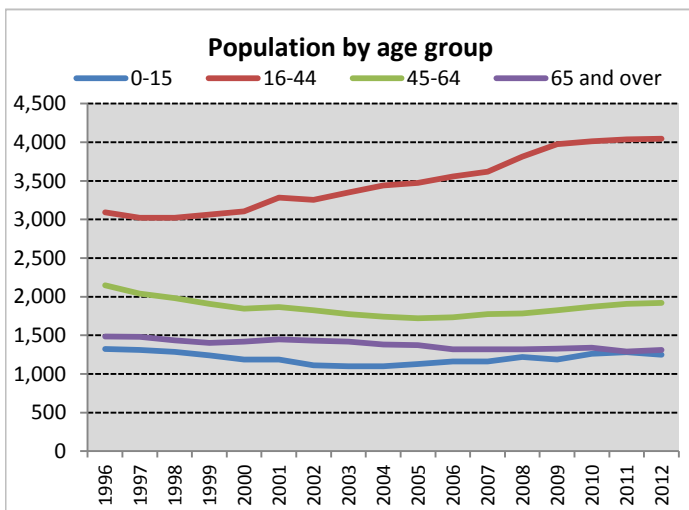
Women in Greater Gorbals live, on average, nine years longer than men. The estimate of male life expectancy in Greater Gorbals is below the Glasgow average. The area has high levels of income and employment deprivation compared with the Glasgow average. A low proportion of the households in the area are owner occupied. Single parent households make up 53% of all households with dependent children.

Life expectancy for both males and females has risen slightly in recent years in Greater Gorbals, and has stayed below Glasgow average. In the most recent period shown (2008-12), life expectancy was below the Scottish average for both males and females.



The overall population of Greater Gorbals rose by around 6% between 1996 and 2012. The increase was only evident in the 16-44 age group. The percentage of the total neighbourhood population from a minority ethnic group increased from 3% in 2001 to 13% in 2011. The percentage of the neighbourhood's population from an ethnic minority group was slightly above the Glasgow average in 2011.

Notes

1. Data sources: Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation (SIMD) 2012, Census 2011, Census 2001, HMRC, NOMIS, National Records of Scotland (NRS) and Scottish Government.
2. Populations presented in the population trend chart and used to calculate life expectancy estimates are taken from NRS small area population estimates and are based on: the 2001 census for the years 1996 - 2001; both the 2001 and 2011 census for the years 2002 - 2010; and the 2011 census for the years 2011-2012.
3. The Income deprivation and Employment deprivation indicators are derived from SIMD 2012, more information on this deprivation index can be found at: <http://simd.scotland.gov.uk/publication-2012>
4. Life expectancies are calculated based on population estimates and death registrations. 95% confidence intervals have been added on the graphs to give an indication of their accuracy. The x-axes of the life expectancy graphs give the mid-year for each life expectancy estimate e.g. 2010 represents the life expectancy estimate for the period 2008 - 2012.
